



Points are used to decide who gets places


Maximum is 625. Average is 350.

DARE

(Disability Access Route to Education)

A third level admissions scheme for school leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their second level education





HEAR (Higher Education Access Route)

A third level admissions scheme for school leavers from long-term socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds

HEAR HIGHER EDUCATION ACCESS ROUTE

What is the HEAR Criteria?

HEAR Income Threshold plus a combination of two other indicators

Indicator 1 = Family Income thresholds

Indicator 2 = Medical Card /GP Visit Card

Indicator 3 = Means-tested social assistance payment

Indicator 4 = Socio-economic group underrepresented at third level

Indicator 5 = Attendance at a DEIS School > 5 years

Indicator 6 = Resident in an area of urban/rural disadvantage



How much does university cost?



Eligible for the Free Fees Initiative?

Students pay a student contribution charge of €3,000 per year and a Student Contribution fee of €150.

SUSI

Apply to SUSI for a grant towards student contribution or tuition fees.

How to pay?

The first installment is €1,650 due at registration with the balance of €1,500 due before the 31st January 2021.

Repeat

- < 31st October 0% Tuition Fees
- < January 31st 50%
- > February 1st 100%

Campus Accommodation and Cost

1,200 1st Year Students live on campus

Main campus accommodation is a short walk to all lecture, sports and recreational facilities on the North Campus.

50% of all campus accommodation is reserved for 1st year students

The average annual cost is between €4,700 to €6,700.




