Summary: January 2023 Monthly Meeting

 - the new classrooms and resources as a agreed in September 2021
 - to support the increased pupil numbers (30 p.a.)
 - and for the College to meet its requirements under the Education for Persons with Special Educational Needs Act 2004 from September 2023
- School self evaluation on the impact of Covid 19 on students educational experiences and outcomes.
 - Phase 1: inputs will be from teachers
 - Phase 2: inputs from pupils in 2nd year, TY and LC2P.
 - Phase 3: information gathered from this survey may be used to plan timetabling interventions relevant supports and programmes of work or learning experiences for students.

BOM Update re Extension & Resources - Update

- Letter sent by the PA association to the Board of Management of the College in advance of their January meeting requesting the following:
 - What are the plans and specific timelines for the building of new permanent structure classrooms and the provision of adequate resources to meet the requirements of
 - a. The extra thirty first year pupils per annum.
 - b. The intake of pupils with special educational needs.
 - As per the above the building of new permanent classrooms may not take place for some time, what are the Department of Education and the Board of Managements short term plans for the coming new school year of 2023/24 as the College is at full capacity.
- The responsibility and accountability is with the BOM to ensure sufficient resources
 are available to meet the requirements of the College as per legislation or otherwise
 both now and in the future.

TY Pool Brainstorm - Update

Key Observations

- A number of structured TY programmes paused since Covid, e.g. hospitals etc.
- Many local businesses and community organisations always support CCC TY students, e.g. schools, CK Hotel, Community Centre they can only take 6 students during the scheduled TY placement.
- Parents / Students experience of TY placement this year, last two years isn't reflective of prior TY years, office based placements not as available.

Next Steps

- Draft letter / sales pitch re: TY placements for school year 23/24.
- Survey Monkey: parents can their places of employment offer work / community experience.
- Explore stand at Plant sale to promote TY and gets offers and advertising for co's who place students
- List of companies and organisations that have placed students pre and post Covid.
- How to use Plant Sale for TY students.
- Students to search for placements TY.ie.
- Contact local Chamber of Commerce / Enterprise office.
- Co's who participate maybe students drop in CV / quick interview.
- Develop a 'sales pitch' to use when approaching company what TY placement is and isn't
- Explore options re: format of "set weeks" with TY co-ordinator / teachers.
