#### Election of parents' representatives to the Board of Management <u>section 6</u>:

The purpose of the parents' representatives on the Board of Management is:

- To report back to the Parents' Association and keep them informed of matters that are relevant.
- It was voted on that we <u>remove this paragraph</u>. As the purpose of the PA nominations to the BOM of the College are the same as any other Board member as set-out in the guidelines as published by the ETBI (Education and Training Boards Ireland). Thanks to Kevin Elliott and Paul Fallon for doing the review.
- Update on mock interviews, 39 students were scheduled and 19 parents participated, 8
  of whom were new. There are significant benefits to the students in doing the
  interviews. Going forward would like to have a greater uptake from the traditional LC
  students



- Lorraine Hagerty who organises the event is looking to handover the reins in the next 2 years, so volunteer(s) needed
- For the position of <u>Assistant Secretary for the PA Cathriona Brennan</u> was proposed by Fiona Ward & 2nd by Carol McQuaid and was elected, thank you to Cathriona for volunteering.
- John Cronin asked that we remember <u>loan Butean</u>, <u>father to Andra & Andrei</u>, who passed away in October. Ms Anamaria Butean, SNA in St Brigid's Castleknock.
- JC results were published in October and were very strong, and were <u>above the</u> <u>national average</u>, so well done to all students.
- Up-coming events are information evenings for 1st years and CAO evening for 6th years



- Award ceremony on the 23rd November for <u>48 students who exceeded 500 points</u> in LC 23.
- The <u>uniform supplier is going to tender and PA volunteers</u> required to review submissions from circa 5 interested suppliers. Reviews to take place in Jan/Feb and final decisions in Mar/Apr
- Code of Behaviour & The Suspension & Exclusion Policy is due for review along with Acceptable Usage Policy to be completed by end of December Niamh Glennane and Kevin Elliott volunteered
- Annual review of the <u>Child Protection Policy and Counter Bullying policy</u> (January/February 2024), <u>PA volunteers required</u>.
- Applications for first years 2024 closed 27<sup>th</sup> October and <u>over 550 applications for 210</u> <u>places</u>.



- <u>John Cronin also asked for support for the TY program</u> placements particularly to help those students who may not parents/family that can support them in getting a placement. <u>Stephen Connolly will reach out to Ms Dunne</u> to show what we have done to date and how we can support the school with.
- The proposed <u>extension plans are progressing</u>, and John Cronin will provide an update at each of our monthly PA meetings. The <u>PA will support the College as and when required to bring this to fruition</u>.
